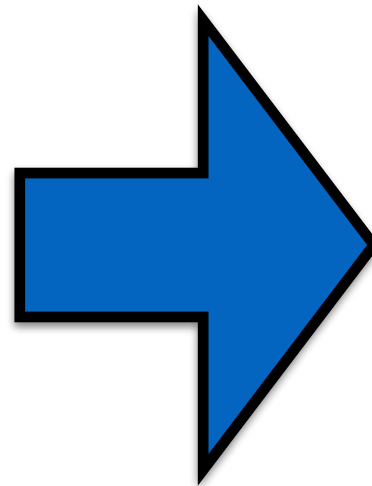

PREP DAY

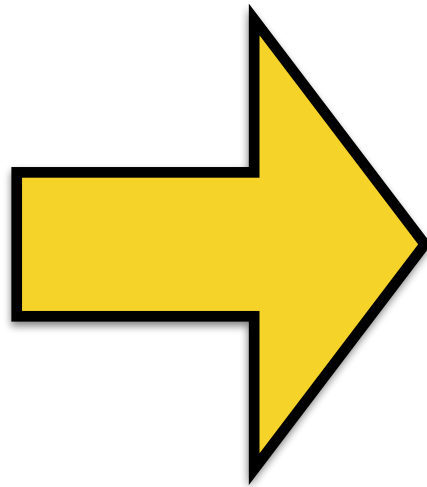
Step 1: Download SMI/SRI App



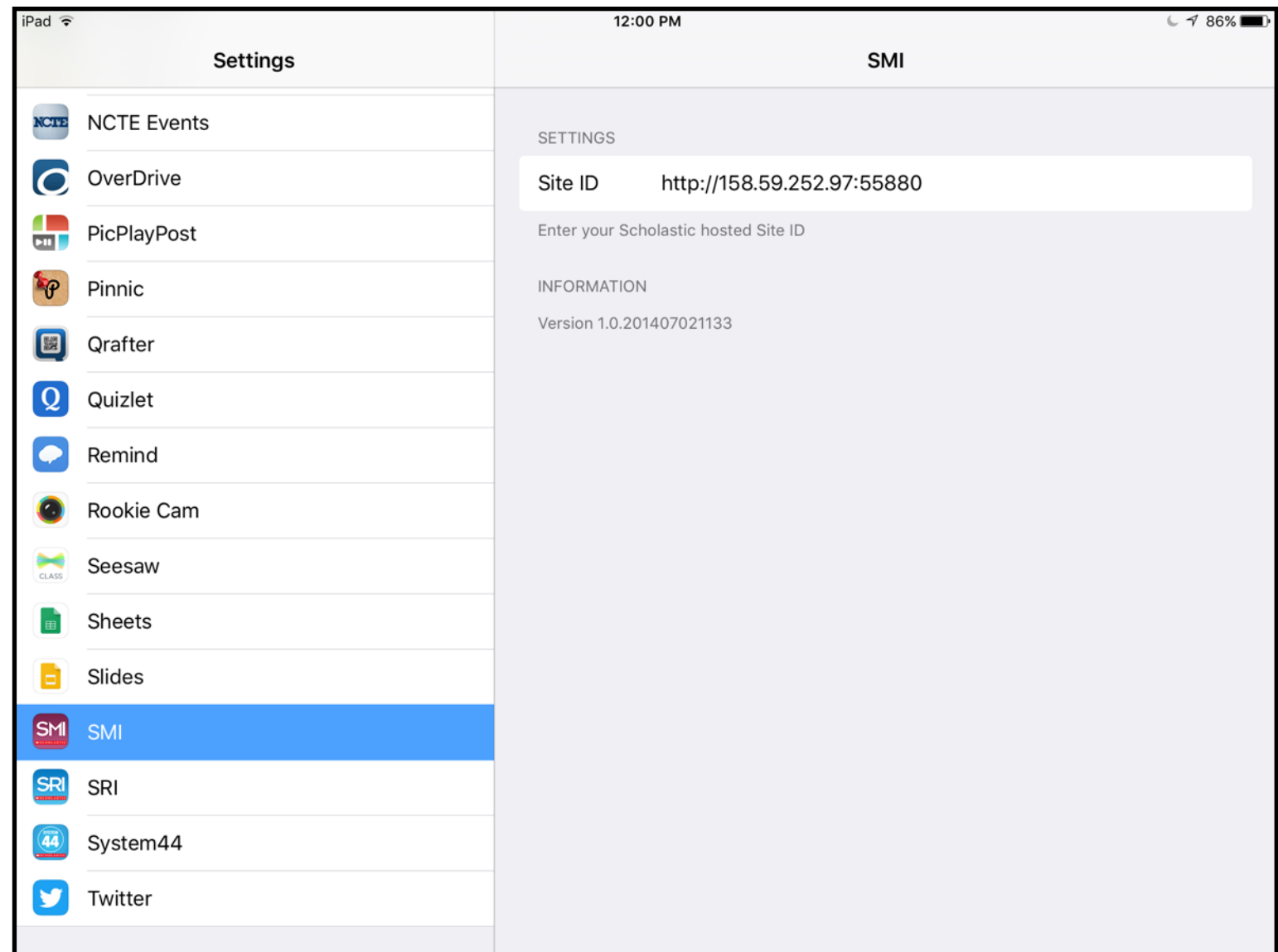
PREP DAY

Step 2: Set Up in Settings

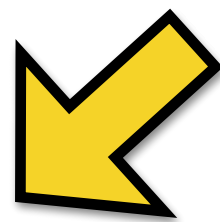
1. Go to Settings

Read-Aloud Students:


- Plug in headphones

- Tap on “Español” for read-aloud to be in spanish

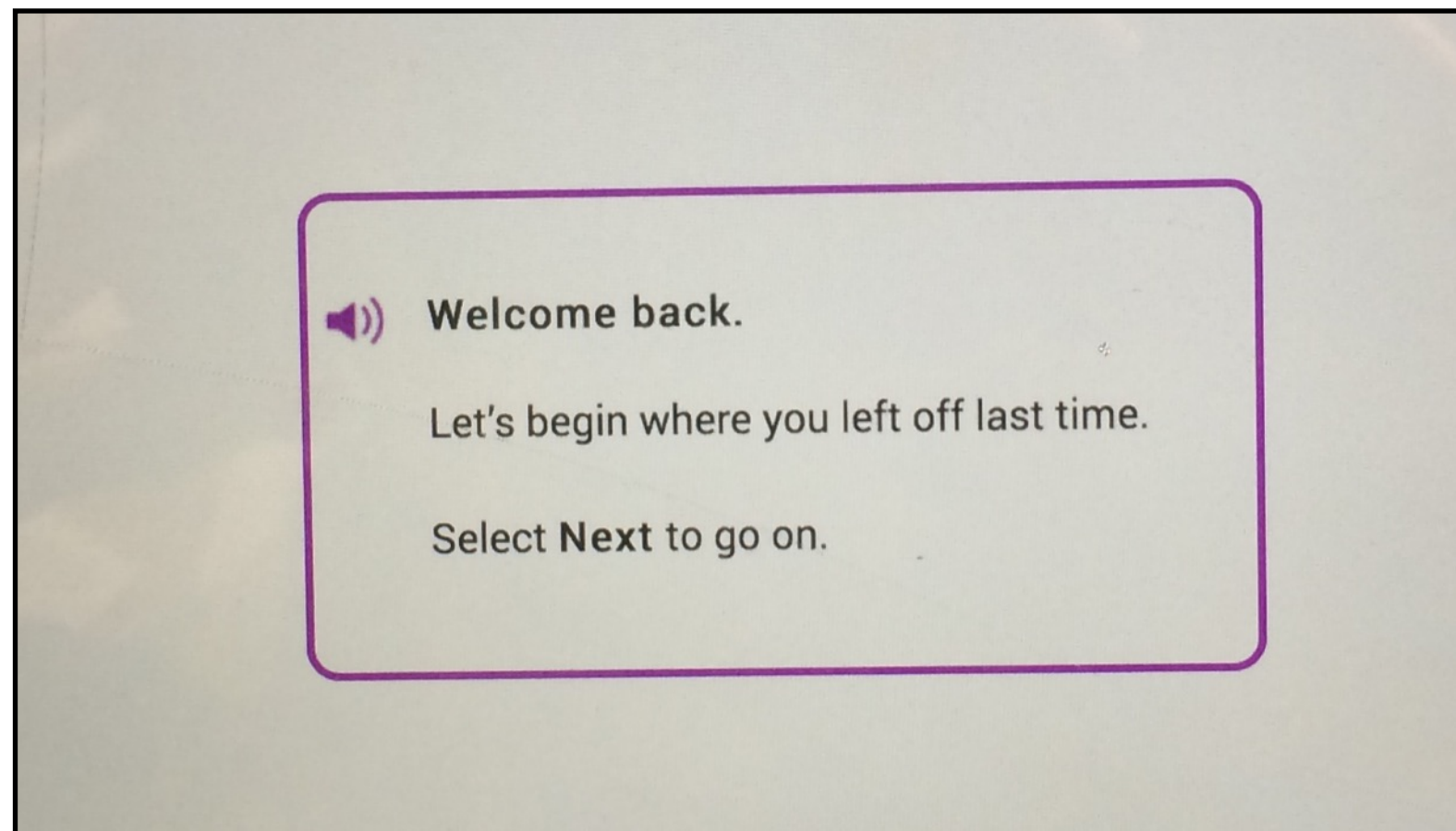
TEST DAY TIPS
