

All IB schools have four required policies that should receive input from the whole school: <u>Academic Honesty</u>, <u>Assessment</u>, <u>Inclusion</u> and <u>Language</u>. Every policy was reviewed or rewritten last year. The policy that needs the most attention is our assessment policy, which doesn't currently

meet several MYP requirements.

Written Curriculum

Our Science classes, among others, are trying something new this year: fully aligning MYP assessment with our APS grading policy. We begin with backward planning the year with a range of summative assessments. Then backward planning the lessons from each unit's summative assessment(s).

In Sciences all content, skills and assessments are aligned with the following criteria: A-Knowing and Understanding, B-Inquiring and Designing, C-Processing and Evaluating, and D-Reflecting on the Impacts of Science. The idea is that by making grades based on known criteria, across grade levels, grading can become more consistent, transparent and fair for all.

MYP Classrooms & Authentic Assessments

Our 8th Grade performing Art students already have learned how to put on a show! Of course, they have much more work to do in honing their skills, but they are already demonstrating commitment,



creativity and talent in pulling off their dancing and lip syncing performances. In three classes, five teams competed in front of four to five judges. Often the results were very, very close. The scores weren't announced until the end of each class.
