As we move into the third quarter now is a good time to remind everyone about our Academic Integrity policy. Below are the main community rights and responsibilities.

Teachers should: teach proper ways to acknowledge others' work, provide simple, clear guidelines, provide examples, and administer the online pledge.

Students should: complete their own work, give credit to others, use appropriate ways to signal use of sources, focusing on APA style citations, ask a teacher for help, and sign the online pledge.

Civics Town Hall with Congressman Beyer


