




High School Level 1high school credit class

A note about the IB program at W/L

If you are planning on applying to the IB Program at Washington/Liberty please be aware of the following requirements:

- You MUST complete Algebra I or Algebra I, Intensified by the end of 8th grade
- You must complete TWO years of a World Language (please note: ASL does NOT count as a world language under this program) only Spanish, French, Arabic. Latin or Chinese are considered for IB applicants.
- Earn all A's and B's as final grades in middle school.


- We will use Naviance a few times this year to create a high school plan
 - There are a lot of options in High school, it is important to start considering them early







- Click on Single Sign On




