

School Calendar:

At the bottom of the TJMS homepage you will find a [calendar of upcoming events](#); at both the school and APS level. It does not include after school club meetings, ACT II schedules, or sports practices. Press the “view all” button to see a full month of events and scroll through upcoming months. You can subscribe to the calendar via the +iCal and +Google links at the bottom right corner of the calendar.

Monthly Activities Calendar:

In the left-hand column of the TJMS homepage you will find a link to the Monthly Activities Calendar. This calendar has a detailed list of events happening at TJMS during and after school including assemblies, field trips, club meetings, and ACT II. The second page of the calendar lists sports practices and games. The calendar is published on a monthly basis and each month is available a few days before the start of that month.

Morning Announcements

Students hear daily announcements during the Teacher Advisory period (TA). Announcements include reminders about daily activities, extra curricular programs, upcoming events, and notice of whether it is an A or B day (more information in School Organization). Parents/guardians can explore them here: “[morning announcements](#)” or through our webpage menu.

School Organization

Grade Level Teams

Each sixth and seventh grade student is assigned to an academic team and will take most of their classes from teachers within that team. This creates smaller learning communities to support students’ transition to middle school. Eighth grade students are not assigned to teams, rather they are randomly assigned based on course selection as well as other factors. Each grade level plans relationship-building activities and field trips throughout the year. TA Teachers may request funds at the beginning of the year to go toward team activities and/or field trips. Teacher Advisor Program (TA)

Each student is assigned a TA teacher/class. Students go to TA at the beginning of every day to participate in lessons focused on social emotional learning, IB MYP expectations, productive study habits, executive functioning, and test taking skills.

English Learner (EL)

The English Learners program serves students from diverse linguistic and cultural backgrounds. The program works to ensure that English learners (ELs) attain English proficiency in order to develop high levels of academic achievement. Based on a yearly English language development assessment (ACCESS for ELLs), or an assessment by the Welcome Center, students receive tiered levels of English language instruction.

- English Learners with beginning proficiency (ELP 1-2) receive at least 2 instructional blocks with an English Learner (EL) teacher. (English Language Proficiency (ELP) 1 meets 4-5 periods; ELP 2 meets 2-4 periods)
- English Learners with advanced proficiency (ELP 3-4) receive at least 1 instructional block with an EL teacher. (ELP 3-4 meets 1-2 periods)
- EL Resource teachers provide ELL instruction for students (ELP 1-4) who additionally receive Special Education services. EL instruction is provided through the student's Special Education classes.
- All EL students are assigned to a grade level team.

Special Education

TJMS offers a continuum of Special Education services and placements. To the greatest extent possible and in accordance with the requirements for Least Restrictive Environment (LRE), students with disabilities (SWD) are educated with their non-disabled peers. However, students who need more specialized instruction can be educated in any combination of inclusion, co-taught, or self-contained classroom settings. IEP (Individualized Education Program) meetings take place weekly on Thursdays. TA FLEX

TA FLEX is a 30-minute period that takes place during TA (Tuesday, Thursday and Friday) and is designed to provide extra help to students in a particular subject area. TJMS instructional staff determine which students will be assigned. The first TA FLEX rotation starts mid September.

- 6th and 7th grade students are expected to perform regular community service as part of the IB Programme and to reflect on that service. They will be given information on the expectations for service and how it will be tracked in the beginning of the school year.
- All 8th grade students will plan and implement a Capstone service project, their Community Project. Students will work with the IB Coordinator to determine the nature and scope of the project.

Math Progression

Each June, a countywide team of mathematics specialists, teachers, counselors, and administrators meet to determine the mathematics course recommendations for all rising TJMS students. The team considers multiple measures linked to students' knowledge of content, reasoning ability, and readiness for instruction. The recommendation is shared with families and students through ParentVue at the end of June or early in July. Advanced Academic & Talent Development (AATD)

AATD Information Night is held in October. This session will provide in-depth information on how services are provided at TJMS. Students identified as gifted in a subject area are grouped together within the regular

Act II Classes

Act II is a graded semester class that is included in a student's schedule as well as on their report card. The classes meet after school on Tuesday and/or Thursday from 2:40 - 4:00 p.m. Students are expected to attend all sessions. Classes are offered in Art, Drama, Chorus, and Technology. Information on which classes are offered each semester will be available on the homepage of the TJMS website. Students will have the opportunity to sign up for fall Act II classes a few weeks after the semester has begun by turning in a form to their school counselor. These forms must be signed by the parent/guardian.

SOLs

Students take the following Standards of Learning (SOL) tests in the Spring. Scores are mailed to families in August.

6th Grade: Reading, Math

7th Grade: Reading, Math, Civics & Economics

8th Grade: Reading/Writing, Math, Science

Homework and Homework Assistance

Homework varies by teacher and team. Study Hall is offered from 2:40-3:30 p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays. Study Hall is a quiet classroom space for students to work, staffed by teachers who can answer questions or support students in completing homework. Students can attend on an as-needed basis.

Arlington Public Schools has partnered with **Paper** to provide unlimited access to trained tutors so every student in grades 6-12 can ask questions, work through problems, and grow their confidence—at no cost to families. **Paper** is an online, on-demand academic support service that provides students with unlimited, 24/7 academic support. Whether students are stuck on homework, studying for a test, or need someone to read and make suggestions to their writing, there will always be experts available online to assist students one-on-one in [all subject areas](#) and in more than 4 languages. High School Credits

A few classes at TJMS (including some advanced math, world geography, and world language classes) receive high school credit. The credit and grade will appear on your student's high school transcript and be part of their grade point average (GPA) unless you request otherwise.

Health and Physical Education (H.P.E.)

All students take P.E./Health. P.E. uniforms (shorts and t-shirt) are available for purchase at the beginning of the year and are highly recommended to ensure TJMS students are readily identifiable indoors and outdoors. No uniforms are required during the health units. Only tennis or athletic shoes are allowed (**No crocs, sandals, boots, or open-toe shoes**).

Lunch

Each grade level has a separate lunch period. After school has been in session for a few weeks, students will have the option to go outside for recess at the designated time upon completing their lunch. Staff supervision is provided.

How to Know How Your Child Is Doing In School

ParentVUE (<https://vue.apsva.us/>)

ParentVUE is an online tool that provides parents/guardians with access to the latest information about student attendance and classwork. Families can view class assignments, scores, report card grades, and course history with ParentVUE. This is an extremely helpful way to regularly check to see how your child is doing. The Grade Book page allows you to see if your child is missing homework assignments or tests before it is too late to make them up. Students have access to the same information through their StudentVue accounts.

If you do not have an existing ParentVue account, you should receive a letter with a Parent Account Activation Code from TJMS. If you never received the code, you can get a new one from the **TJMS Registrar**, Ms. Ana Mejia: 703-228-5908, ana.mejia@apsva.us. Student-Led Conferences

Conferences are held twice a year, once in the fall and once in the spring. Parents/guardians meet with their child and their child's TA teacher. The conferences are student led, meaning that the student has prepared information to present to her parents/guardians. TA teachers will help guide students through their presentation.

In 2024-2025, the dates are October 11 and March 14.

How to sign up

Instructions will be sent out via email on how to electronically schedule your 20-minute conference.

To schedule meetings with teachers other than your child's TA, contact the teacher directly. If you need additional assistance, contact your child's school counselor.

Interpretation

APS will provide an interpreter for the conference, if needed. You can request an interpreter when you schedule your conference appointment.

Technology

iPads

Every student receives a personal iPad and charger cord. 6th and 7th grade students keep the iPad during the summers and return it to the school at the end of 8th grade. Students use these devices all the time in their classes, do much of their homework on them, and often use them to take tests. Students are expected to charge their iPads at home and bring them to school every day. They will receive a list of guidelines for appropriate use of their iPads and the consequences for misuse. Personal Phones

APS has new student electronic device rules in place for the 2024-25 school year. Our goal is to ensure that our students turn their devices off and put them away during instruction. For elementary and middle school students, phones must be off and away for the entire school day. For high school students, phones must be off and away during instructional periods.

APS is launching a Cell Phone Storage Pilot Program for the 2024-25 school year at four secondary schools, beginning in mid-September. Participating schools are Wakefield High School, H-B Woodlawn (middle school only), Swanson Middle School and Thomas Jefferson Middle School

After School Activities

Act II Classes - See School Organizations

Clubs

TJMS offers a great variety of optional after school clubs. These include clubs focused on activities (such as chess, and art), service, academic interests, identity and issues, music, and drama. Club and activity meeting days and times vary. Clubs are a great way for students to meet others who share their interests or to learn new things. Clubs are listed by day on the TJMS website under the "Activities" tab.

Music & Drama

Band, Orchestra and Chorus occasionally schedule after school rehearsals. Students will receive a schedule from their teacher with all rehearsal dates. Parents/guardians with children in the music program will also be invited to sign up for the Charms program, an online resource with a calendar and ways to sign up to volunteer. There are also optional music programs that meet weekly after school such as jazz band and advanced chamber music. **Drama** productions are held twice a year (fall play and winter/spring musical) and have regular rehearsals after school. Students audition for these productions. Typically, there are more roles open for the spring production than the fall production.

Sports Choice

Sports Choice is a voluntary after-school intramural program that meets Monday -Thursday. Students play basketball, volleyball, flag football, soccer and other sports in a non-competitive environment. No registration is needed; students just drop in to the gym after school before 2:40 p.m.

Late Buses

Late buses depart at 4:15 p.m. Only students who stay after school under TJMS staff supervision for clubs, tutoring, study hall, sports and other school related activities may ride the late bus. Students participating in the Thomas Jefferson Community Recreation Center teen program are not permitted to ride the TJMS late bus. Late buses stop at almost every regular bus stop, but combine multiple bus routes so will not be identical to the student's regular bus assignment. TJMS students can view late bus stops on their grade level Canvas page.

Check-In: Extended Day

Open from 2:35 - 6:00 p.m. Monday - Friday (September - June); **Fee based program**

The Check-In program is Extended Day's after school program for middle school students. The Check-In program provides students with a structured, supervised environment that allows them to participate in a variety of Check-In activities and the extracurricular activities at TJMS. Students who are enrolled in Check-in must sign-in at Check-in before they go to a school activity. After the activity they must return to the Check-in program. Check-in students, with parent permission, are also able to sign themselves out and leave the school campus. Once a child has signed out for the day, they cannot return to the Check-in program.

Thomas Jefferson Recreation Center Teen Program

Open from 2:35 - 6:00 p.m. Monday - Friday (September - June) **Free program**

This is a free after school program for teens to have fun, make new friends and develop skills. Programs can include music, dance, games, cooking, art, sport games, and activities chosen by teen participants. Teens are

Tryouts and Game Dates

Tryouts and game dates will be provided at the beginning of the year through the Monthly Activities Calendar and on the TJMS website under the “Activities” tab.

Team Practice

Most sports have daily practice from 2:40 - 4:00 p.m. The swim team and diving team practice at the Washington-Lee pool. Coaches will disseminate schedules. Students eligible for busing can take a late bus home after practice.

TJMS Sports Banquet

A sports banquet is held at the end of each season (fall, winter, spring) to recognize athletes. It is a dessert reception and athletes and family are invited to attend.

Important Events

Harvest Festival - October

The Fall Harvest Festival is a major community event. It takes place outside the main entrance on an evening in October and brings together the TJMS community including students, their families, neighbors and TJMS staff. Participants can explore the TJMS garden and listen to the chorus perform and enjoy seasonal treats. Kids have fun watching a movie outside on hay bales. Pumpkins are raffled off at the end of the evening. The event is free with the option to buy pizza by the slice.

International Night - April

International Night takes place on a Friday evening in April in the TJMS gym. The event is for the whole family and is a fantastic celebration of the international flavor of our IB community. There are student performances, a student fashion show of clothing from around the world, an art display, professional entertainment (usually music or dance), face painting, henna tattoos, and more. Throughout the evening, the PTA holds a basket raffle fundraiser. The baskets are a joint effort between TJMS families and the PTA. Families donate items based on themes chosen by the TAs (movie night, spa day, cooking, etc.). The PTA solicits additional donations from local businesses and combines all the items to create beautiful baskets. Raffle tickets are sold during the event.

Transitioning to Middle School: Supporting Your Child

- Encourage your child to get involved in areas that interest him/her and to try new things. After school activities are a good way to meet other students with shared interests.
- Set Technology guidelines and monitor your child's use.
- Make sure your student gets enough sleep, exercises, and eats a healthy diet.
- Check ParentVue regularly to identify academic problems before they go too far. Encourage your child to check StudentVue regularly as well.
- Help your child find/develop ways to cope with stress (art, yoga, sports, listening to music, meditation, gardening).
- Help your child develop organizational skills. Students will work on learning these skills at TJMS, but it will help them if you work on it at home as well.
- Help them learn to problem solve, self-advocate and develop independence. Encourage your child to talk directly to his teachers if he has questions or problems with assignments. Don't jump in right away to fix it or to get the answer. Help him/her brainstorm/roll play interactions with adults or peers.
- Contact your child's School Counselor if you have questions about how to handle any specific issues or concerns (screen use, bullying, drug use).
