



Principal's Update

It's hard to believe we're already so close to the end of the 2024-2025 school year! To help ensure the safe arrival and departure of our Yellow Jackets, please take note of the following drop-off and pick-up guidelines:

- The parent/guardian drop-off and pick-up lane in front of Alice West Fleet on S. Old Glebe Road is designated for TJMS and AWFES families.
- Students should use the main walkway from the parent drop-off and pick-up lane to walk to and from TJMS.
- Parents/guardians should avoid using the bus lane from 7:15

 9:15 AM and 2:15 4:15 PM. Adhering to these hours helps prevent families from getting caught between buses and allows bus drivers to move efficiently in and out of the TJMS bus lane as they continue their routes for other APS schools.
- For safety reasons, drivers should never make U-turns in the bus lane or on S. Old Glebe Road.

Also, please help our Yellow Jackets arrive at school by 7:40 to start the school day on a positive note!
